








Arrival at the Bandaranaike International Airport – you will be met by our representative and transferred in a luxury Toyota Prado to the Amaya Signature in Dambulla. DAY TWO: DAMBULLA – SIGIRIYA – KANDY

After an early breakfast, proceed to climb Sigiriya Rock Fortress, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

*Sigiriya Rock Fortress – sometimes referred to as the 'Eighth Wonder of the World', the Sigiriya Rock Fortress is an iconic attraction in Sri Lanka. Dating back to the 5th century and built during the reign of King Kasyapa, the fortress was also known as the 'Lion Rock' due to the massive lion structure that is believed to have been constructed at its entrance. For over 18 years it served as a royal citadel and features unique water gardens, ornate rock frescoes known as the 'Sigiriya maidens' and a special Mirror Wall with ancient verses etched onto it. Those reaching the summit can look forward to not only seeing ruins of the palace but also some truly breathtaking panoramas. Proceed to Kandy – visit a spice garden and a batik factory on the way.

Enjoy a sightseeing tour of the sacred city of Kandy, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The last great kingdom of ancient Sri Lanka, this city lies nestled in the heart of the mountains, around 480 metres above sea level. Steeped in history, Kandy offers a unique perspective of the island's rich heritage; visit the famed Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic and Royal Botanical Gardens and take in picturesque views of the city from the Upper Lake Drive.

Kandy is also well known for offering plenty of opportunities for shopping and you can enjoy some retail therapy by purchasing distinctive Sri Lankan handicrafts, jewellery, gems or batiks.

*Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic – located within the royal palace complex, this historic temple is one of the island's most sacred sites, especially amongst Buddhist devotees. Locally referred to as the 'Sri Dalada Maligawa', the temple is home to what is believed to be a tooth relic of Lord Buddha and is the focal point of the annual festival known as the Kandy Esala Perahera.

Overnight stay in a Deluxe Room at The Hunas Falls by Amaya including a four course set menu dinner and set menu breakfast.

DAY THREE: KANDY – KOGGALA

After breakfast, visit the Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage and Royal Botanical Gardens

*Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage – established to take care of young elephants that were orphaned, the Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage is one of the island's most popular tourist attractions. Also involved in captive breeding, this orphanage offers a unique chance to observe these gentle giants up close, especially during feeding and bathing times; baby feeding times are generally at 09:15am and 01:15pm, while the immensely popular bathing sessions at the nearby river take place daily from 10:00am to 12:00pm and 02:00pm to 04:00pm.

*Royal Botanical Gardens – located in Peradeniya, Kandy, the Royal Botanical Gardens is one of the premier botanical gardens in the country. It features a huge array of over 4,000 plant species which include endemic and foreign flora. Among the highlights here are its orchids, cannonball trees, talipot palms, medicinal plants and variety of spices which help make it one of the finest botanical gardens in Asia.

DAY THREE TO DAY FIVE: KOGGALA

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After an early breakfast proceed to climb Sigiriya Rock Fortress, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

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Proceed to Kandy – visit a spice garden and a batik factory on the way.

Explore the sacred city of Kandy, the country’s last great kingdom which lies amidst mist shrouded mountains. A UNESCO World Heritage Site, this city has a rich history and offers much to see and do; head to the famous Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic, enjoy spectacular vistas of Kandy from the Upper Lake Drive and spend time at the Royal Botanical Gardens.

Kandy is also a great place for some retail therapy and offers you a chance to buy some distinctive souvenirs and gifts from Sri Lanka including batiks, gems, jewellery and handicrafts.

DAY THREE TO DAY FOUR: KANDY – NUWARA ELIYA

After breakfast, visit the Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage and Royal Botanical Gardens

*Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage – one of Sri Lanka’s most beloved attractions, the Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage gives visitors a chance to get up close with these gentle giants. Started with the purpose of looking after orphaned young elephants, the orphanage is also involved in captive breeding. The bathing and feeding sessions are definitely the highlights here; the much loved bathing time is at a nearby river from 10:00am to 12:00pm and 02:00pm to 04:00pm. The baby elephant feeding sessions are generally at 09:15am and 01:15pm.

*Royal Botanical Gardens – amongst the premier botanical gardens in Sri Lanka, the Royal Botanical Gardens is home to over 4,000 plant species. Located in Peradeniya, Kandy, the site not only features endemic flora but foreign plant species as well. It is one of Asia’s finest botanical gardens and is well known for its collection of orchids as well as talipot palms, spices, cannonball trees and medicinal plants.

Proceed to Nuwara Eliya.

Stop by a tea factory en-route to see how world famous Ceylon tea is produced and prepared.

Referred to as ‘Little England’, Nuwara Eliya resembles an old English town complete with a picturesque lake, quaint cottages, horse racing track, an Anglican church and even an 18 hole golf course. Visit the Hakgala Botanical Gardens which is home to more than 10,000 species of flora including an exotic collection of roses, orchids and ferns.



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DAY FIVE : YALA – KOGGALA

After early breakfast, experience the typical Sri Lankan wild life safari in the morning.


Yala combines a strict nature reserve with a national park. Divided into 5 blocks, the park has a protected area of nearly 130,000 hectares of land consisting of light forests, scrubs, grasslands, tanks and lagoons. Two blocks are currently opened to the public. Situated in Sri Lanka's south-east hugging the panoramic Indian Ocean, Yala was designated a wildlife sanctuary in 1900 and was designated a national park in 1938. Ironically, the park was initially used as a hunting ground for the elite under British rule. Yala is home to 44 varieties of mammal and 215 bird species. Among its more famous residents are the world's biggest concentration of leopards, majestic elephants, sloth bears, sambars, jackals, spotted deer, peacocks, and crocodiles. The best time to visit Yala is between February and July when the water levels of the park are quite low, bringing animals into the open.
